Summary of Findings

1. EXTREME INEQUALITY: 50 SUPER RICH INDIVIDUALS VS THE MAJORITY OF THE PEOPLE

- 1.1 The Wealth of the 50 Richest Individuals is Equivalent to that of 55 Million Indonesians
- 1.2 Without Changes in the Economic and Political Structure, the Wealth of the 50 Richest Individuals is Projected to Equal that of 111 Million Indonesians by 2050.
- 1.3 The total wealth of the 50 richest individuals is greater than the State Revenue and Expenditure Budget (APBN)
- 1.4 A Total of 0.000000174% of the Population Controls Wealth Equivalent to that of 18.6% of Indonesians
- 1.5 Oligarchs' wealth increases by \$770 thousand per day, while workers' wages increase by only \$10 cents per day.
- 1.6 A Total of 57 Private Jets Produce 46,170 Tons of CO₂e per Year, Equivalent to 7,825 Cars and 51,876 Motorcycles
- 1.7 The Wealth of the 50 Super Rich Individuals is Equivalent to 1.4 Times the Combined GRDP of Papua, Maluku, Nusa Tenggara, Bali, and Sulawesi Islands
- 1.8 It Would Take 603 Years to Spend the Wealth of the Top Five Trillionaires if Spending \$118 thousand per Day
- 1.9 A Total of 58% of the Wealth of the 50 Richest Individuals Comes from the Extractive Sector
- 1.10 Workers Need to Work for 2.8 Centuries to Match the Wealth of the Top 50 Trillionaires
- 1.11 The Average Public Savings Amounts to Only IDR1.67 Million while the Savings of the Super Rich Reach IDR35.9 Billion

2. THE CONTRAST BETWEEN THE WEALTH OF STATE ELITES AND THE PEOPLE

- 2.1 The Total Wealth of Public Officials in the Merah Putih Cabinet Reaches \$1.7 Billion
- 2.2 A Total of 73% of Cabinet Wealth is Controlled by Only 12 Officials with Wealth Above IDR59 Million
- 2.3 In a Single Election Cycle, the Political Cost of Winning a Presidential and Vice Presidential Election Reaches IDR580 Million
- 2.4 A Worker Needs to Work for 2 Centuries to Match the Wealth of the President of the Republic of Indonesia.

- 2.5 The Younger Generation Needs 104 Years to Match the Wealth of Gibran Rakabuming Raka.
- 2.6 Every Low-rank Private (Tamtama) Needs 252 Years of Service to Match the Wealth of the Indonesian National Armed Forces Commander-in-Chief.
- 2.7 Every Lower-ranking Police Officer Needs 233 Years of Service to Match the Wealth of the National Police Chief.
- 2.8 The Total Wealth of Members of the House of Representatives of the Republic of Indonesia Reaches \$1.6 Billion and that of the Regional Representative Council of the Republic of Indonesia Reaches \$133 Million.
- 2.9 Legislators from the Gorontalo Electoral District Have Average Wealth 810 Times Greater than the Average Wealth of Their Constituents.
- 2.10 The Potential Revenue from a Wealth Tax on Executive and Legislative Officials Reaches \$44.5 Million.
- 2.11 A Total of 9 Public Officials in the Merah Putih Cabinet Also Serve as Chairpersons of Political Parties, Controlling Three Fifths of the Valid National Votes.
- 2.12 Eight Officials in the Merah Putih Cabinet are Closely Affiliated with Extractive Businesses

3. WHAT CAN A WEALTH TAX ON THE 50 TRILLIONAIRES FUND?

- 3.1 Potential State Revenue from a Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Individuals in Indonesia Reaches \$5.5 Billion
- 3.2 If All Super Rich Individuals with Asset Values Above \$4.9 Million in Indonesia Were Subject to a Wealth Tax, \$8.4 Billion Would Be Collected.
- 3.3 A 2% wealth tax on the 50 richest individuals could lift more than half of the poor population out of poverty within 2 years.
- 3.4 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Build 387 Thousand Houses for Low Income Communities
- 3.5 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Ensure that 21.7 Million People Have Their Basic Living Needs Properly Fulfilled
- 3.6 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Provide Scholarships to 1.2 Million University Students until Graduation
- 3.7 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Provide 41.34 Million Tons of Fertilizer to Farmers
- 3.8 The Allocation of Wealth Tax Revenue Could Reduce Commuter Line Crowding by Adding 40 New Train Sets and Providing Free Services for 8 Years
- 3.9 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Finance 465 Thousand Scientific Research Projects

- 3.10 If the Wealth Tax Were Invested in Microhydro Power Plants, National Energy Capacity Could Increase by up to 1.76 Gigawatts.
- 3.11 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Purchase More than 5.8 Million Solar Powered Lamps for Remote Villages.
- 3.12 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Restore 5.47 Million Hectares of Tropical Rainforest
- 3.13 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Cover 180 Million BPJS Contribution Assistance Beneficiaries
- 3.14 All Online Motorcycle Taxi Drivers in Indonesia Would Receive a Vehicle Maintenance Subsidy of US\$787 per Year
- 3.15 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Pay All Honorary Teachers US\$257 for 2 Full Years
- 3.16 All Health Workers Could Potentially Receive Incentives of Around US\$289 per Month for One Year.
- 3.17 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Support Economic Access for Persons with Disabilities Amounting to US\$361
- 3.18 A Wealth Tax on the 50 Richest Trillionaires Could Guarantee Old Age Protection for 34 Million Elderly People
- 3.19 Every Family with Toddlers Would Receive US\$540 per Year for Childcare Services.
- 3.20 US\$0 for costs for chronic diseases such as dialysis free.
